## <u>Writing</u>

Students will follow the writing process and be given opportunities to plan and compose written pieces for a specific purpose. They will focus on extending their vocabulary and awareness of grammar and apply more descriptive, topic-specific language to make their writing clearer.

Students will continue to apply various strategies when spelling known and unknown words. They will be encouraged to use an editing checklist to reread and edit their work for meaning and accuracy. Students will explore using an analogue clock Students will tell time to the quarter-hour using the language of 'past' and 'to'.



Students will interpret simple maps of familiar locations and identify key positions on a map using features such as keys and coordinates.

#### <u>Italian</u>

Students will participate in a variety of songs, games and other activities to build their confidence in using keywords and phrases.
